



Program Purpose



Office of Early Childhood Development (OECD)

Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five (PDG B-5) Renewal Grant

Opportunity number: HHS-2024-ACF-ECD-TP-0055



The PDG B-5 Grant:

- Aims to strengthen existing ECE programs in a mixed delivery system across the state and give children access to highquality early childhood care and education from birth through kindergarten.
- Focuses on the programs and systems that prepare and support underserved children to enter kindergarten.
- Allows states to build to their Planning grant efforts by investing in the early childhood workforce and expanding access to high-quality ECE programs through a mixed delivery system to address ongoing needs in preparing children to enter kindergarten.
- Allows state to make sure that underserved children and their families—including those in high-poverty and rural communities—can access ECE services and support.

2024 PDG B-5: Three Year Renewal Grant

Illinois has a long history of work to support a strong workforce and mixed delivery system.

The PDG B-5 Renewal Grant provides Illinois an opportunity to:

- Build on successful early childhood work in the State (Funding Commission, PDG B-5 Planning Grant, Transition Work, Smart Start, Regional Infrastructure)
- Innovate, pilot, and research ideas that otherwise would be challenging

Funding:

Federal (ACF), competitive, available to
 25 states; anticipate 10 awards

Timeline:

Three Years (9/30/24 -9/30/27)

Maximum Award:

IL is eligible for up to \$27m over three years (\$9M/year)

Application Due Date: July 31, 2024

Federal Priorities

1. Maximize family participation and engagement in the state's mixed delivery system

- Ensure meaningful participation of parents and stakeholders
- Increase access through application and enrollment systems
- Increase access for infants/toddlers and reach "underserved" children
 - Including children living in rural areas, families with low incomes, in the child welfare system, experiencing homeless, multi-lingual, special needs, and more
- 2. Workforce (compensation, pathways, mental health & well being; diversity, support to use inclusive and culturally and linguistically responsive practices)

3. Program quality and alignment

- Integrated B-5 ECE system
- Suspensions, expulsions, and other exclusionary practices
- Transitions (Infant/Toddler to Preschool to K)
- Mental health and well being
- ECE program sustainability


Grant Structure

Must also make efforts to:

- Prior Work: Consider and/or build on lessons learned
- **Funding:** Leverage additional funding to increase impact
- Data: Link data across early learning and health systems
- Performance: Include a plan for evaluating performance
- **Systems:** Include information about how Illinois will use the grant to strengthen the early childhood system



Goals of the Renewal Grant



Goal for Illinois is to leverage grant funds to move towards a more equitable and coherent system

Simpler, Better, Fairer

- Aligns to the vision of the new Department of Early Childhood
- Supports families' choice and strengthens the IL's ECEC mixed delivery system for children birth to five across the state
- Ensure a strong B-5 workforce
- Ensure services for IL's hardest to reach populations, including families with young children with special needs and families with multi-lingual learners
- Supports the mental health and well-being of children, families, and the workforce


Guiding Principles for Selecting Projects

All proposals are welcome!!!

This proposed project....

- 1. Centers equity for families with young children and advances equity, and diversity in providing services
- 2. Aligns with transition to goal for the Department of Early Childhood: A simpler, better, fairer system for families with young children
- 3. Builds upon current continuous improvement/innovative work when possible
- 4. Includes a focus on underserved populations (income, home language, rural, etc.) and/or Illinois Priority Populations and/or populations identified in the draft TAC equity framework
- 5. Are individual projects reasonable to complete, considering time it takes to execute contracts, hire staff or contractors, etc.
- 6. Fewer larger projects


